This Is My Story by Jennifer Evans

I was 42 year old de-greed single African-American woman with no children and back in my home town. I was an under-employed former university Assistant Professor in a town with 3 institutions of higher learning, many school districts, and several media outlets, but with limited access to gainful and meaningful employment.

I was living in my deceased grandfather's 820 square foot house with my mother whose home had just recently been damaged by fire and was declared uninhabitable. I desired to have my own space and sought pricing on affordable apartments. Price points on decent and affordable housing was out of my reach. As a result,

a friend encouraged me to apply with Waco Habitat. My pride said "no", but something bigger than me, my faith, said "submit". And thus began the journey with Waco Habitat.

After moving into my home, I had a single black woman come up to me and say,

"I didn't think someone like me (a single woman) could be a part of this program, but because I see you, I can do it too."

I am grateful that Waco Habitat serves all kinds of families, including singles, who just need a hand up in fair times or during a down time. Habitat for Humanity is a model of hope, decency, and sustainability, and I would not trade this experience for anything else.

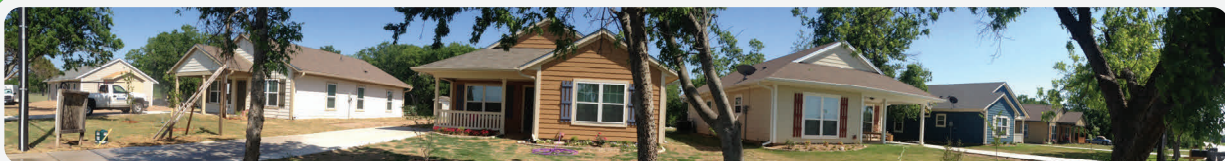

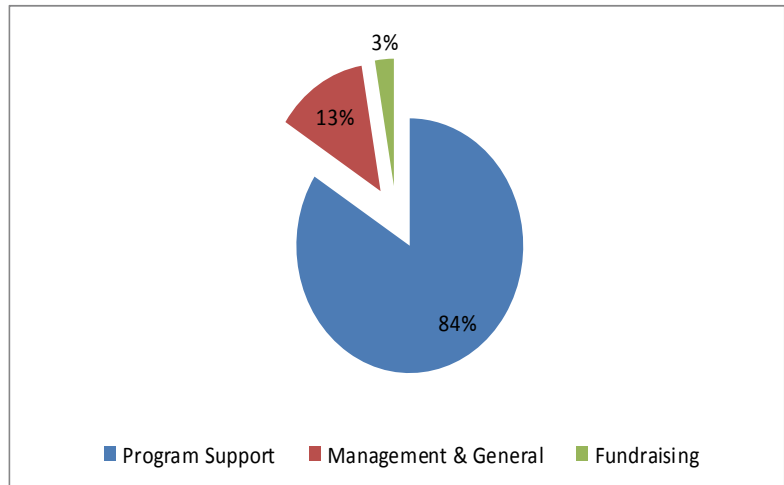

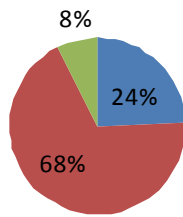
