Waco Habitat for Humanity, Inc., founded in 1986, is a nonprofit, ecumenical Christian housing ministry that seeks to provide a decent house in a decent community for all of God's people in need. Habitat invites people from all walks of life to work together in partnership to help build and repair houses with partner families. Habitat builds homes in partnership with low-income families, and those homes are built and repaired using primarily volunteer labor. Our partner families serve alongside Habitat staff and volunteers as they move toward either repairing the home they already own or eventually purchasing their home through a zero-interest loan.

Summary/Objective:

The Construction Supervisor works closely with the Director of New Home Construction and supervises construction of homes through Waco Habitat for Humanity partnership housing program.

- Able to stand and walk for the majority of a work day; walk and climb on uneven surfaces; climb ladders and stairs; bend, lift, grasp, reach, push, and pull materials and tools to move them into and out of vehicles and to move them around the construction site; give and receive detailed

information through verbal communications; and periodically lift and move loads up to 75 pounds.

Duties and Responsibilities:

The Construction Supervisor will assist the Director of New Home Construction in the following tasks:

- Supervise construction process including material procurement, site management, working with subcontractors, inspectors and code enforcement personnel.
- Provide overall leadership for worksite, assuring all construction needs and volunteer support needs are met.
- Work with and develop relationships with sub-contractors, volunteers, homeowners and others involved in building Habitat homes.
- Prepare job site for construction crews. (i.e., safety plan, materials, tools, work plan)
- Supervise and teach groups of volunteers, homeowners, work-study students, and others on the work site.
- Inspect projects to ensure conformance with local, state, and federal construction codes as required.
- Coordinate delivery of materials to job site.
- Assure all inspections and rights to proceed happen in a timely fashion.
- Assure all construction projects come in on time with within approved budget.
- Prepare house for inspections and work with code officials to ensure compliance with appropriate codes.
- Ensure mission of Habitat for Humanity is carried out to its fullest.
- Perform other duties as assigned.
